## Who should attend

This course is designed for operators of lorry-loader cranes to ensure that appropriate health and safety requirements are met.

A well maintained lorry-loader and suitable loads and slings/lifting tackle will be required. Additionally, an appropriate room for the theory training will be needed. To ensure compliance with accreditation FTA is required to operate a maximum trainee/instructor/machine ratio of 3:1:1.
